A wonderful first week of learning last week, there are so many 'best bits' it was hard to choose! Don't forget, you can zoom in to take a closer look!




Year 3 have listened to a range of composers such as Mozart, Holst, Mussorgsky and Williams. They've identified instruments in Peter and the Wolf by Tchaikovsky - but not only this, they've composed their own piece using crotchets, minims and semibreves and

played these on a digital keyboard. Wow!

Year 6 are continuing their work on statistics by looking at mean, median and mode. They've been finding 'mean' in pairs using concrete resources before moving on to a more abstract method.

EYFS have been using two dice to make their own calculations independently, also learning how to present their work really neatly on squared paper. In English they have been predicting what their new story is about by looking at the front cover of the 'Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs' book. The children have also enjoyed running and bean bag and



Year 1 have been working on finding equal and unequal groups in maths. They worked outside and used lots of different resources to make equal groups up to 20. Now they've practised with the

resources they'll move onto drawing groups and using them to solve repeated addition problems.

Year 4 have had a fabulous start to the second half of the summer term. They've been looking at how to write a letter of complaint. Using their Viking book as a theme, the children have written a letter of complaint to the managers of 'The Viking Hotel'. Let's hope they get their refund!





Year 5 have also had a fantastic first week back. They've particularly enjoyed checking on their sunflowers to see how much they have grown!

Finally, Year 2 have been identifying which countries lie close to and far from the equator to explore our global climate. It's a hugely important geographical study as they need to find the most suitable locations for their vast variety of dragons to

reside in. I'm sure you will agree with Isaac that the Polar Regions will just not do for his magma dragon, nor will they provide suitable habitat for Mrs McGhie's beardie – a docile creature who prefers the hot, dry forests. Luckily, Year 2 are on the case!
